Keep Camdenon Parks Beautiful Report Vandalism & Property Damage

We know that many citizens use and enjoy the park areas and the City continues to invest money to maintain and expand the options available but each time there is intentional damage, it takes money away from other possible projects and can cause the area to be closed while damages are repaired.

Help us keep our park nice. If you see someone causing damage, there are 3 ways you can take action:

- If you feel comfortable or know the person, tell them to stop.
- You can call 573-346-2243 for the Police to respond immediately
- Or you can call the TIPS Line at the Camdenon Police Department 573-317-1800 to leave information about the damage and who is responsible.

April showers bring May flowers, growing grass and weeds!

Spring rains bring life back to our flowers, grass and weeds! Just a reminder that a house with an overgrown yard is an eyesore in any neighborhood – not to mention a violation of City Ordinance. Vacant lots, yards, sidewalks and alleys overgrown with tall weeds are not only unsightly, but they can harbor rodents and reptiles and can become a fire hazard – this is a nuisance.



This is not only an issue in the residential neighborhoods, but also impacts our business community. While businesses routinely dedicate time and effort to the store layouts for customer appeal, we would like to remind our business owners that the exterior is just as important.

A customer may choose to shop elsewhere if a business has overgrown weeds in front of their business.

The primary problem in the spring and summer is grass and weeds. City Ordinance 215.005 states grass, weeds and other vegetation growing to a height in excess of seven (7) inches within the City limits is a nuisance violation. Please be mindful of this as you begin planting flowers and gardens each spring, as they will require attention throughout the growing season. We hope citizens and business owners will comply voluntarily. If a violation is observed the property owner or occupant will be notified to correct the problem.

Helmet Safety

- An appropriate helmet should be worn whenever a child is "on wheels." This means bicycles, scooters, skates, rollerblades, skateboards and more!
- Make sure the helmet fits the adult or child properly.

Pedestrian Safety

- Teach children to walk, not run, across the street.
- Whenever crossing the street, try to make eye contact with any drivers nearby, to be sure they see you.
- Teach children to avoid running out from between parked cars.
- Use sidewalks whenever possible.
- Always hold your child's hand near any moving or parked vehicles.

Water Safety

- Parents need to focus on their children 100% of the time when in the water - NO distractions!
- Remember, no one is "drown proof."
- Children can drown in many different water sources including: bathtubs, toilets, buckets, baby pools, swimming pools, streams, creeks, lakes, rivers, and oceans.
- The Camdenton Aquatic Center offers swim lessons each year. Once the dates have been confirmed, the information will be available at www.camdentoncity.com.

Sun Protection

- Sunscreen should be applied 15-30 minutes prior to sun exposure and be applied at least every 2 hours or sooner if sweating or swimming. Look for a sunscreen with a SPF of at least 15.
- When weather is warm, make sure you stay hydrated by drinking plenty of water and fluids!

As temperatures warm up and turn from Spring into Summer, please do not leave your kids or pets unattended in a vehicle at any time while the car is not running.

When it is 70 degrees outside, the inside temperature of a car can rise above 100 degrees in a matter of minutes even with a window cracked! It is better to take your child with you or leave your pet safely at home than putting them in this dangerous situation!

Also, before going for a walk check the road, if it is too hot for your hand or foot, it is probably too hot for your dog's paws too.

INDEPENDENCE DAY – JULY 4TH

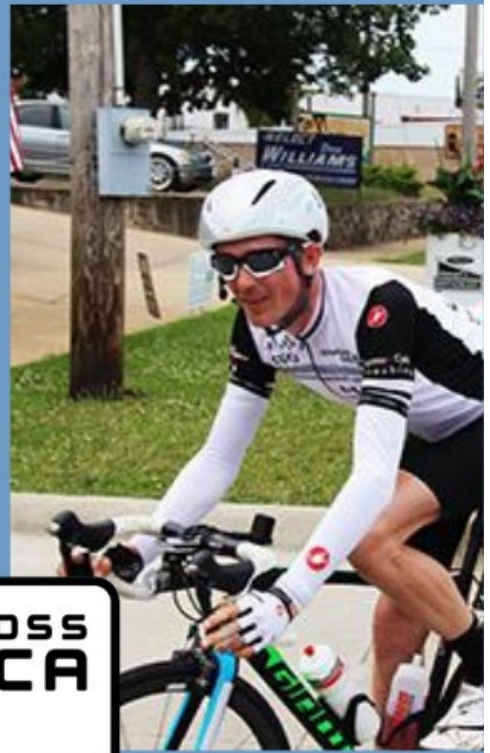
