From Mayor McNabb...

Well, same old story, record high temperatures in July and very dry conditions. As I write this article, we had 3" of rain last night. Hopefully, the heat is behind us for the most part, and we can enjoy our last few weeks of summer.

Sadly, I must mention the passing of Dennis North. Dennis was a lifelong resident, a former alderman, and mayor, as well as the City's Community Service Officer for several years. We will honor Dennis with a resolution from the Board of Alderman at tonight's (August 1st) board meeting.

Several of our annual projects have been completed by the Public Works Department. The street overlay on Panoramic Drive and Cedar Street is finished. We have also done a water line replacement in the area of Wilkerson Avenue. Our Public Works Department is busy mowing and cleaning up around town.

We are currently in the process of formulating our next budget. I would like to thank City staff for their work to make this process go smoothly and to plan for the needs of our community.

There are several dates to remember as we move towards Fall. The City Pool will only be open on weekends after August 11. They will remain open until Labor Day. Dog Dippin' Days is September 9th, and that will officially close the Pool. School starts August 22nd. Please watch for students and traffic as the new school year begins. The Run/Walk for the Fallen will be held at the City Airport again this year on September 9th beginning at 9:00AM. The City and the Camdenton Area Chamber of Commerce host this event. This year we are adding a car show/cruise in which will go from 10:00AM-2:00PM. Admission is free to the public. Arts in the Park will be Saturday September 16th. Lots of activities for everyone that day. The Fall City-Wide Cleanup will be on your regular trash pickup day the week of September 25-29. We will also have another City-Wide Garage Sale September 22-23.

We are still sponsoring 2 incentive programs to bring new police officers to the City. One program pays individuals to attend the Police Academy in Columbia to become a certified officer. The other program is an incentive program for officers who already hold certification. Both programs require a 5year commitment to the City. For information contact Chief Beauchamp at the Police Department, 346-3604.

I would like to acknowledge the working relationship with the Camdenton Chamber of Commerce and the City. Recently, the Chamber brought national recognition to the City and area with their sponsorship of the rest station at Signal Convenience store for the annual Race Across America bicycle race. The participants were very complimentary of the hospitality provided by the Chamber volunteers.

Sunday, November 5, Daylight Saving Time ends, so remember to set your clocks BACK one hour.

This is also a good time to check, test, and replace the batteries in your smoke detectors and Carbon Monoxide detectors.

Remember, smoke detectors should be checked monthly and replaced every 10 years!



Fall Clean Up

City-Wide Clean-Up September 25-29, 2023

To participate, simply place your unwanted items at curbside on your regularly scheduled trash pickup day during that week only. GFL will collect items. There is no additional charge for extra items put out during the City-Wide Residential Clean-Up. There will NOT be a collection point behind the old City Hall in the parking lot. Please do not take items to that site. Please remember also that this clean-up is for City Residences with ACTIVE Trash Service only!

Some items require special preparation by you before they can be picked up:

- ✓ All items must be set at the curb by 5:00 am
- ✓ As much as possible, items need to be bagged or bundled so that the materials can be handled easily
- ✓ All lumber, guttering, and other items of length must be tied in bundles and cut in 4' lengths so they can be easily handled
- ✓ All tires must be removed from the rims

Although we have tried to make arrangements for all of your unwanted items, there are still some things that will not be accepted:

- ✓ NO HAZARDOUS WASTE of any kind
- ✓ NO NON-COMPACTABLE MATERIALS such as wood waste, bricks & blocks, rocks, or shingles
- ✓ NO CONSTRUCTION OR DEMOLITION DEBRIS such as drywall or plywood
- ✓ NO LIQUID WASTE of any type such as paints, pesticides, oil, etc.
- ✓ NO YARD WASTE such as brush, limbs, grass, or leaves
- NO CAR PARTS such as motor oil, batteries, pick-up beds, etc.
- ✓ NO CONCRETE, WHITE GOODS or large solid items that could damage their equipment

City-Wide Garage Sale September 22-23, 2023

The Fall City-Wide Garage sale is Friday and Saturday, September 22 and 23. The City will be waiving the garage sale permit requirement for those days only. This is a great way to pass on those "previously loved items" in addition to cleaning up the residential areas of our town. For this to be successful, the City is counting on you, our citizens! **WE WILL NOT BE PUTTING OUT A MAP FOR THIS GARAGE SALE.**

With that in mind, please remember that it is illegal, per Section 400.220 of the City of Camdenton Municipal Code, to place Garage Sale Signs on any City or State property. This includes all utility poles, stop signs, street signs, stop lights, any City or State right-of-way including the City square. Please refrain from posting illegal signs, or they will be removed. **The Right-of-Way is 20 feet from the roadway.** Please, do not put garage/yard sale sings, realtor signs, election signs, business signs, or any other kind of sign within 20 feet of the roadway.

IT'S ALMOST TIME FOR FALL LEAVES...

It will soon be the time of year when the air begins to chill, and leaves begin to fall. That means the City will be filled with the sights and sounds of leaves being raked, mower's mulching up leaves and, in some cases, the smell of leaves being burned. If you do plan on burning leaves, please be



sure to call Mid-County Fire Protection District at (573) 346- 3262 to make sure conditions are favorable for burning. One of the best methods for ridding your yard of leaves is to mulch them into the yard with your lawn mower. It not only provides a good nutrient base for next year's growth cycle, but it takes less time than raking and is easier on the body.

For those of you who are not going to mulch, burn, or rake your leaves into the woods behind your house, the Camdenton Public Works Department will begin the annual leaf pick-up starting late this fall. In the November City Newsletter, there will be a map to help you locate what section your property is in and what week your leaves will be picked up. For pick-up, please place your leaves in a pile next to the ditch (**NOT IN THE DITCH OR STREET**) and be sure there are not any limbs, rocks or other debris mixed in with the leaves. Please ensure your leaves are out the week of your area. We plan on working only on the week specified for your area. <u>The exact start date of the leaf pick-up & map will be posted at www.camdentoncity.com and the City of Camdenton's Facebook Page as we get closer to fall – last year it was the end of November before this began. The leaf pick-up schedule may be adjusted for weather or other unforeseen circumstances as needed. Due to limitations in personnel and equipment, we will only pick up leaves once a year.</u>

Fire Prevention Week

October 8-14, 2023

As Fire Prevention Week approaches, the Md-County Fire Protection District reminds residents that

"Cooking Safety Starts with YOU"

The Md-County Fire District is teaming up with the National Fire Protection Association—the official sponsor of Fire

Prevention Week for more than 100 years —to announce "Cooking safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to fire prevention" as the theme for Fire Prevention Week, October 8–14, 2023. This year's focus on cooking safety works to educate the public about simple but important steps they can take to help reduce the risk of fire when cooking at home, keeping themselves and those around them safe.

According to NFPA, cooking is the leading cause of home fires, with nearly half (49 percent) of all home fires involving cooking equipment; cooking is also the leading cause of home fire injuries. Unattended cooking is the leading cause of home cooking fires and related deaths. In addition, NFPA data shows that cooking is the only major cause of fire that resulted in more fires and fire deaths in 2014-2018 than in 1980-1984.

"The numbers don't lie! We need to increase our community's awareness to cooking hazards and how to prevent them," said Lianne Johnson, Fire Marshal with Md-County Fire Protection District. "During this year's fire prevention week, we hope to get out information on all the tips, tricks, and recommendations that will help to reduce the risk of home cooking fires."


The following are cooking safety messages that support this year's theme, "Cooking safety starts with YOU Pay attention to fire prevention":

- Always keep a close eye on what you're cooking. For foods with longer cook times, such as those that are simmering or baking, set a timer to help monitor them carefully.
- Clear the cooking area of combustible items and anything that can burn, such as dish towels, oven mitts, food packaging, and paper towels.
- Turn pot handles toward the back of the stove. Keep a lid nearby when cooking. If a small grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan, and turn off the burner.
- Create a "kid and pet free zone" of at least three feet around the cooking area and anywhere else hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

"Staying in the kitchen, using a timer, and avoiding distractions that remove your focus from what's on the stove are among the key messages for this year's Fire Prevention Week campaign," said Lorraine Carli, vice president of the Outreach and Advocacy at NFPA

Fire Prevention Week is celebrated throughout North America every October and is the oldest public health observance on record in the US. Entering its 101st year, Fire Prevention Week works to educate people about the leading risks to home fires and ways they can better protect themselves and their loved ones.
