

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF THE CITY OF CAMDENTON BY AMENDING PRESENT TITLE VI: BUSINESS & OCCUPATION; CHAPTER 600: ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; SECTION 600.240: SCHEDULE OF FEES TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH STATE STATUTE

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CAMDENTON AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Title VI: Business & Occupation; Chapter 600: Alcoholic Beverages; Section 600.420: Schedule of Fees:

SECTION 600.240: SCHEDULE OF LICENSE FEES

The following classes of licenses shall be issued upon compliance with the provisions of this Chapter, and payment of the license fee indicated:

Original package intoxicating liquor in excess of 5% alcohol by weight	\$ 150.00
Retail sale of all kinds of intoxicating liquor by drink, including package sales	450.00
Retail intoxicating liquor by drink-picnic (7 days)	37.50
Retail intoxicating liquor by drink-caterers (per day)	15.00
Sunday liquor by drink license	300.00
Original package malt liquor not in excess of 5% alcohol by weight (includes Sunday sales)	75.00
Retail sale of malt liquor not in excess of 5% alcohol by weight and light wines containing not in excess of 14% alcohol by weight, by drink	75.00
Retail sale of malt liquor not in excess of 5% alcohol by weight, by drink (includes Sunday sales)	75.00
Retail sale of malt liquor not in excess of 5% alcohol by weight, by drink-picnic (7 days)	37.50
Retail sale of malt liquor not in excess of 5% alcohol by weight-caterers (per day)	15.00
Original package non-intoxicating beer not in excess of 3.2% alcohol by weight	22.50
Retail sale of non-intoxicating beer not in excess of 3.2% alcohol by weight, by drink	37.50

- A. Original Package intoxicating liquor in excess of 5 % alcohol by weight (OPL) – (Convenience Stores, Groceries, Liquor Stores) – *Allows retailers to sell intoxicating liquor in the original package, not to be consumed upon the premises where sold.* \$150.00
- B. Retail Sale of all kinds of intoxicating liquor by drink, including package sales (RBD) – (Spirits, Wine and Beer) – *Allows retailers to serve intoxicating liquor by the drink for consumption on the licensed premises and to operate between the hours of 6:00 AM and 1:30 AM on weekdays and Saturdays, including all election days.* \$450.00
- C. Retail Intoxicating liquor by drink – picnic (7 days) (RBDP) – (Not of Profit Organizations-Spirits, Wine and Beer – 7 days) –*May be issued to any church, school, civic, service, fraternal, veteran, political or charitable club or organization for the sale of such intoxicating liquor for consumption on the premises at a picnic, bazaar, fair or similar gathering. The permit shall be issued only for the day or days named therein and it shall not authorize the sale of intoxicating liquor for more than 7 days by any such club or organization. Allows for sales in the original package for consumption off the premises. If the event will be held on a Sunday, the permit shall authorize the sale of intoxicating liquor on that day beginning at 11:00 AM and ending at midnight.* \$37.50
- D. Retail intoxicating liquor by drink – caterers (per day) (RBDC) – (Spirits, Wine and Beer) –*Allows retailers who furnish provisions and services for use at a particular function, occasion or event at a particular location other than the licensed premises to sell intoxicating liquor by the drink at retail for consumption on the premises and in the original package for consumption off the premises for a specified period of time. The caterer’s permit can be effective for up to 168 consecutive hours or seven days. If the event lasts past midnight, the licensee must also pay for the next day.* \$15.00
- E. Sunday liquor by drink license AND Sunday intoxicating liquor by package – (Sunday License – Spirits, Wine and/or Beer) (SOP) - *This is a secondary license, which means they must have a primary license to be able to sell on Sunday. Retailers may obtain a license to sell intoxicating liquor between the hours of 9:00 AM and midnight on Sunday. 5% Beer licensees can sell on Sunday without a secondary license.* \$300.00
- F. Original package malt liquor not in excess of 5% alcohol by weight (includes Sunday sales) – (5OP) – *This license allows retailers to sell beer in the original package, not to be consumed upon the premises where sold.* \$75.00
- G. Retail sale of malt liquor not in excess of 5% alcohol by weight and light wines containing not in excess of 14% alcohol by weight, by drink (5BDW) – *Allows retailers to serve 5% beer and light wine by the drink for consumption on the licensed premises. This license allows retailers to operate between the hours of 6:00 AM and 1:30 AM on weekdays and Saturdays, including all election days.* \$75.00
- H. Retail sale of malt liquor, not in excess of 5% alcohol by weight, by drink (includes Sunday sales) – (5BD) – *Allows retailers to serve 5% beer by the drink for consumption on the licensed premises. Allows retailers to operate between the hours of 6:00 AM & 1:30 AM on weekdays and Saturdays between the hours of 9:00 AM & midnight on Sunday.* \$75.00
- I. Consumption on the Premises (COL) – (Building and Hall Rentals) – *Allows any person operating any premises where food, beverages or entertainment are sold or provided for compensation to permit the drinking or consumption of intoxicating liquor on the premise. Licensee cannot sell any intoxicating liquor. Hours of operation – between the hours of 6:00 AM and 1:30 AM on weekdays and between the hours of 6:00 AM and 12:00 midnight on Saturday including all election days.* \$90.00
- J. Liquor Solicitor (LS) - *Allows for the selling to licensed wholesalers and* \$375.00

soliciting orders for the sale of intoxicating liquor of all kinds, to, by or through a licensed wholesaler within this state. May be located out of state or instate.

- K. **Liquor Manufacturer Solicitor (LMS) – (Spirits, Wine, Beer) - Allows for the manufacturing, distilling or blending of intoxicating liquor of all kinds within the State of Missouri and the privilege of selling to licensed wholesalers and soliciting orders for the sale of intoxicating liquor of all kinds, to, by or through a licensed wholesaler within Missouri.** \$675.00
- L. **Liquor Wholesale Solicitor (LWS) – (Spirits, Wine, Beer) - Allows licensees to sell intoxicating liquor of all kinds to a person licensed to sell such intoxicating liquor at retail and the privilege of selling to licensed wholesalers and soliciting orders for the sale of intoxicating liquor of all kinds, to, by, or through a licensed wholesaler in Missouri.** \$750.00
- M. **Liquor Manufacturer (22MS) (Wine and Beer) - Allows for the manufacturing of intoxicating liquor containing not in excess of 22% of alcohol by weight and the privilege of selling to licensed wholesalers and soliciting orders for the sale of intoxicating liquor containing not in excess of 22% alcohol by weight, to, by or through a licensed wholesaler within this state.** \$300.00
- N. **22% Solicitor (22S) (Wine and Beer) - Allows for the selling to licensed wholesalers and soliciting orders for the sale of intoxicating liquor not in excess of 22% alcohol by weight, to, by or through a licensed wholesaler within this state. May be located out of state or instate.** \$150.00
- O. **22% Wholesale Solicitor (22WS) (Wine and Beer) - Allows for the selling of intoxicating liquor containing not in excess of 22% alcohol by weight by a wholesaler to a person licensed to sell such intoxicating liquor at retail and the privilege of selling to licensed wholesalers and soliciting orders for the sale of intoxicating liquor containing not more than 22% alcohol by weight, to, by, or through a licensed wholesaler in Missouri.** \$300.00
- P. **5% Solicitor (5S) – (Beer Only) - Allows for the selling to licensed wholesalers and soliciting orders for the sale of malt liquor containing not in excess of 5% alcohol by weight, to, by or through a licensed wholesaler within this state. May be located out of state or instate.** \$75.00
- Q. **5% Manufacturer Solicitor (5MS) – (Beer Only) - Allows for the manufacturing and brewing in this state of malt liquor containing not in excess of 5% alcohol by weight and the privilege of selling to licensed wholesalers and soliciting orders for the sale of malt liquors containing not in excess of 5% alcohol by weight, to, by or through a licensed wholesaler within this state.** \$375.00
- R. **5% Wholesale Solicitor (5WS) – (Beer Only) - Allows for the selling of intoxicating liquor containing not more than 5% alcohol by weight by a wholesaler to a person licensed to sell such malt liquor at retail and the privilege of selling to licensed wholesalers and soliciting orders for the sale of intoxicating liquor containing not more than 5% of alcohol by weight, to, by, or through a licensed wholesaler in Missouri.** 150.00
- S. **Domestic Wine (per 500 gallons) (DOMW) – (Light Wine and Brandy) - Allows the manufacturing of wine or brandy in quantities not to exceed 500,000 gallons, not in excess of 18% alcohol by weight for wine, or not in excess of 34% alcohol by weight for brandy, from grapes, berries, other fruits, fruit products, honey, and vegetables produced or grown in the State of Missouri, exclusive of sugar, water and spirits. A domestic winery may use, in any calendar year, wine and brandy making material produced or grown outside the State of Missouri in a quantity not exceeding 15% of the manufacturer’s wine entered into fermentation in the prior calendar year.** \$7.50

Section 2. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Board of Aldermen and approval by the Mayor.
