HELP US HELP YOU WHEN THE SNOW BEGINS TO FALL!

When Snowfall is expected

The Public Works Department will pre-salt the street to try to keep ice from forming and to aid in the removal of snow. The department has over 25 miles of road to clear as well as City properties and parking areas on the square.

When the Snow falls

When two or three inches of snow have accumulated, or more is expected, plowing becomes more effective than salting. All main roads and residential streets will be plowed by the PWD, which assigns its crews to five plow zones. The department has five trucks for plowing. The first priority is to open the main roads to provide safe access for emergency vehicles and to maintain traffic flow, since most residents live within a few blocks of the main roads. The plows then continue to all streets in each zone until all the streets are clear. If the storm continues, the crews continue working in the same pattern until the storm abates. Then the trucks begin to widen out all roads by pushing the accumulated snow back to the edge of the asphalt and curbs and clearing the intersections. The crews will be out working throughout a storm to clear away the snow. Please do not go out during or immediately after a snowstorm unless it is necessary. Less traffic on the roads means the crews will be able to do their job more quickly and completely. Under the best conditions, it will take 8 to 10 hours after the snow has stopped falling to complete the snow removal operations. Snow removal is an arduous and time-consuming task. Please understand that the Public Works Department cannot shovel out your driveway entrance nor can it plow out any private property.

After the Storm Is Over

Crews continue to monitor all roads for icy conditions and where winds may redeposit snow onto the roadways. Usually, salt is applied so that all surfaces remain safe to drive on. Residents can assist by not throwing snow into the roadway when clearing driveways and sidewalks or push snow across a cleared street. Pushing snow across the street removes the salt laid down for ice control.



Tips and Suggestions

- > If snow is expected, move your cars into the driveway. Parking on the streets during a snowstorm prohibits snow removal.
- Do not park at the end of dead-end streets or in cul-de-sacs. These are needed to push the snow thru and are Fire Lanes.
- If you are shoveling out the entrance to your driveway, do not throw snow directly into the street, shovel onto the side of the driveway or other area of your property.
- If possible, finish clearing your driveway entrance AFTER the final widening pass by the snowplow, which will come about 8 to 10 hours after the snow stops falling, depending on the severity of the storm.

The Public Works Department is committed to the safety of our citizens and providing them with drivable streets.

How to Help Prevent Frozen Water Pipes and Water Meters

When below freezing temperatures are sustained over a few days, water pipes and meters that are close to cold air may freeze. The Camdenton Public Works Department urges residents to take to steps to prevent water pipes and meters from freezing. Frozen water meters and water pipes can stop water service and may be expensive to repair or replace. Property owners are responsible for protecting both water pipes and the water meter from damage. Preventing pipes and the meter from freezing is easier than trying to thaw them. The Camdenton Public Works Department offers these money saving suggestions:



How To Prevent Frozen Water Pipes:

Make frequent use of your water supply. Flowing water often breaks up ice. Keep your faucets circulating by having them drip all day and night as a preventative procedure. It's less expensive than a repair or burst pipe. Eliminate cold drafts near water pipes. Tightly close doors and windows to the outside, install storm windows on basement windows, eliminate drafts from crawl space, fill cracks in the walls and around windows, turn off water connections to your garden hose. **Provide warmth to the water pipes.** Open the door to the room where the pipes are located to allow warmth to circulate. Place a heat lamp near water pipes. Never use open flames. Wrap pipes in insulation or heat tape. If your kitchen or bathroom sink is located against an outside wall, insulate the wall. Open cabinet doors below the sink to allow warm air to reach the pipe.

How To Thaw Frozen Water Pipes:

The pipes are frozen if no water comes from your faucets when you turn them on. Most likely, the pipes nearest a wall, door, window, or along the floor are frozen. Start by opening a faucet near the frozen pipe to release any vapor from the melting ice and so that you'll know when the water starts flowing again. Begin warming the pipes nearest the faucet and work toward the frozen

section. Blow warm air on the pipe using a hair dryer. Do not leave the dryer unattended or allow it to overheat. Do not use a blowtorch or open flame to warm pipes. This is a fire hazard and could cause an explosion. Once water has begun to flow again, let a pencil-sized stream of water flow through the faucet until normal heating is restored to the area. Eliminate cold drafts and allow warm air to circulate around the pipes to prevent freezing again.

How To Help Prevent A Frozen Water Meter:

It is colder near the floor and along the block wall of a basement than at the ceiling, so make sure warm air is circulating around your meter. Follow the previous instruction about preventing freezing frozen water pipes. If your meter is in a separate room, leave the door open to this room to allow warmth to circulate. If your meter is in a cabinet, open the cabinet door. If the meter is in an outdoor pit, check to see that the cover fits properly and that it has no cracks into which cold wind can blow. The pipes, valves and the meter inside such pits should not touch the concrete walls.

If you suspect damage to water pipes or the water meter, call the Camdenton Public Works Department (573) 346-3600 Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

RIGHT-OF-WAY WORK PERMITS

The right-of-way or roadway is the full width of the roads in the City. Most roads are 50 to 60 feet wide with the center 20 feet paved. This means there is 10 to 20 feet on either side of the asphalt that is still roadway. These areas are used for official signage and utilities.

Work such as driveways require permission and a permit issued by the City. City ordinances prohibit placing any materials, signs, or structures within the right-of-way. This includes real estate signs, political signs, and portable basketball goals. While we want our children to exercise, basketball goals left in the right-of-way become a traffic hazard and the owner of the goal is responsible should accidents happen. Please ensure the goals are moved back from the right-of-way after play.

If you plan on working close to the edge of the asphalt, please call City Hall at 573-346-3600 and we will be happy to help you.





With hunting season almost here, it's a good time to talk about firearm safety. Always keep all guns out of reach of children. For maximum safety, ammunition should be stored in a different location than your firearm, have a lock on your firearm when not in use, and store your firearm inside a locked case. For suggestions on

Don't let the Grinch Steal your Christmas

While you are having fun at your Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year Eve's parties, please have a plan for who will be driving! Please do NOT get behind the wheel if you have been drinking or smoking, and do NOT get in a car with a driver who has been drinking or smoking.

Winter Driving Tips

Leave Early

- Allow yourself the extra time to drive slowly and cautiously.
- Clear snow off *all* windows and mirrors before you leave home or work.
- Don't leave a lot of snow on the roof of your car. It can sometimes slide forward when braking and cover the windshield.
- Clear front and rear lights so other people can see you and your signals.
- Leave several car lengths between you and the car in front of you.
- Driving in snow requires anticipation of other drivers as much as looking after your own car.
- Watch the behavior of oncoming traffic; you may have to avoid them if they slide toward you.
- Cars approaching a narrowing of the road uphill will not want to stop in case they can't start again. Cars approaching downhill may be unable to stop without skidding.

Driving on Ice

- Unlike snow, ice is often invisible. You have to guess where it might be.
- Look for reflections in the road surface ahead; what looks like water, may be ice.
- One of the first signs of slippery conditions is if the steering becomes lighter to turn. If you are aware of this effect, you can feel the reduced resistance to your steering wheel movements as the road becomes slippery.
- If you travel a road regularly, note where water collects on the road and may freeze.
- Road bridges freeze first because they lose heat from below as well as above.
- 4x4 vehicles aren't any better than a conventional car on ice. Having two extra driven wheels gives extra traction in snow but they have the same number of braked wheels as an ordinary car, so steering and stopping is not



any better. In fact, being heavier, they tend to have longer stopping distances. There is a danger though, that 4x4 drivers *expect* to have an advantage, and may travel faster than is wise.

Skid Correction

- **Don't brake!** That will make it worse. The simplest response is to ease off on the brake or accelerator and try to keep the front wheels pointing where you want to go.
- Front wheel drive and rear wheel drive cars behave differently. You should refer to your owner's manually for proper handling.

Stock your Car

Carry items in your vehicle to handle common winter driving-related tasks, such as cleaning off your windshield, as well as any supplies you might need in an emergency. Items recommended included:

- Snow shovel and ice scraper
- Abrasive material such as sand or kitty litter in case your vehicle gets stuck on the ice or in the snow
- Jumper cables, flashlight, and warning devices such as flares and emergency markers
- Blankets, extra socks, coat/jacket, gloves, boots, etc. for protection from the cold
- Cell phone charger

PARKS DEPARTMENT

Although we attempt to keep the restrooms open until November 15th at both the Ballpark & on Pam May Drive. IT'S ALMOST TIME FOR FALL LEAVES.....

It will soon be the time of year when the air begins to chill, and leaves begin to fall. That means the City will be filled with the sights and sounds of leaves being raked, mower's mulching up leaves, and, in some cases, the smell of leaves being burned. If you do plan on burning leaves, please be sure to call Mid-County Fire Protection District at (573) 346-3262 to make sure conditions are favorable for burning. One of the best methods for ridding your yard of leaves is to mulch them into the yard with your lawn mower. It not only provides a good nutrient base for next year's growth cycle, but it also takes less time than raking and is easier on the body.


For those of you who are not going to mulch, burn, or rake your leaves into the




woods behind your house, the Camdenton Public Works Department will begin the annual leaf pick-up starting late this fall. Use the map on page 7 to locate what section your property is in and what week your leaves will be picked up. For pick-up, please place your leaves in a pile next to the ditch (**NOT IN THE DITCH OR STREET**) and be sure there are not any limbs, rocks, or other debris mixed in with the leaves. Please ensure your leaves are out the week of your area. We plan on working only on the week specified for your area. <u>The exact start date of the leaf pick-up & map will be posted at www.camdentoncity.com and the City of Camdenton's Facebook Page as we</u>



get closer to pick-up – the tentative start date for Leaf Pickup is November 6th. The leaf pick-up schedule may be adjusted for weather or other unforeseen circumstances as needed. Due to limitations in personnel and equipment, we will only pick up leaves once a year.

Thanksgiving Day – If your trash is normally picked up <u>Thursday</u> it will be picked up <u>Friday</u>, and if your trash is normally picked up <u>Friday</u>, it will be <u>Saturday</u>.

Christmas Day & New Year's Day – Since Christmas Day and New Year's Day both fall on Monday, ALL TRASH WILL BE PICKED UP ONE DAY LATE FOR THESE TWO WEEKS.

PLEASE BE ADVISED OF THE CITY OF CAMDENTON POLICIES – FROM THE CITY CODE – REGARDING WATER/SEWER SERVICE DISCONNECTIONS AND FEES. Section 700.370Sewer And Water — Billing Frequency — Delinquent Bills.

<u>A.</u> Water and sewer customers shall be billed monthly. Billings for any particular cycle shall be made within thirty (30) days after the end of the billing cycle. Payments are due when the billings are made and shall be considered delinquent if not paid by the last day of the month of the billing.

<u>B.</u> A late payment penalty in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the user charge bill will be added to each delinquent bill for each calendar month the bill remains unpaid. [Ord. No. 2653-17, 5-16-2017]

<u>C.</u> Service to water and sewer customers whose bill remains unpaid by the 10th of the following month of the billing shall be disconnected subject to the provision of Section 700.330 of the Camdenton City Code



Section 700.330Reconnection Fee For Delinquent Water Bills.

If water bills remain unpaid by 9:00 A.M. on the 10th day of the following month, service will be discontinued and a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for the first time in a twelvemonth period, a fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the second time in a twelve-month period, a fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the third and subsequent times in a twelve-month period, must be paid before service can be reconnected during normal duty hours of the

Water Department. After normal duty hours and on weekends, a fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) plus the reconnect fee as stated above must be paid before service can be reconnected.

ATTENTION ALL BUSINESSES

With January approaching, it's time to start thinking about your Annual Life Safety Inspections with Code and Fire Official, Chasity Ivey. Since these are annual inspections, you do not need to wait for Business License Renewal notices to be sent out.
